The Indigenous Languages committee (previously Cree Language Committee) was discussed. It was determined the group saw value in the Indigenous Language Committee continuing to meet as a sub-committee of the AEAC.  Transfer Survey conducted following the inaugural meeting (results to be compiled).  Second meeting of the AEAC was held September 2011 at that meeting Ken Ealey (Alberta Education) introduced a newly developed Aboriginal Education teaching resource.

#### Yellowhead Tribal College - Jocelyn Verrault:

- Cree Language Courses being developed
- Indigenous Knowledge and Social Structure Courses based on Native Education taught by an Eminent Scholar.
- YTC has a fulltime Eminent Scholar on staff

#### **University of Calgary -** Darin Flynn:

Language offerings range from Blackfoot to Cree

#### **NorQuest – Dorothy Jacques/Gloria Lizotte:**

- Institution reorganization continues looking at where their aboriginal programs fit
- Upgrading work continues.

#### NAIT - Derek Thunder:

- NAIT's Service centre for aboriginal students does not have an academic component
- Institution going through a transition and streamlining its programs to better connect with the UofA and Grant MacEwan University.
- 16 week semesters being reduced to 15 weeks to facilitate transfer more easily.
- On-line Aboriginal Awareness Program currently open to staff only.

#### University of Lethbridge - Lynn Ambedian:

- 3 Blackfoot offerings
- Regularly offer Blackfoot courses not Cree but offerings are dependent on sessional instructors
- Offer a First Nations transition program to prepare students moving onto University which has about 30 participants

#### **University of Alberta** – Dorothy Thunder:

- Offer 3 Cree language courses 152 Introductory, 252 Intermediate and 352 Advanced
- Developing a Cree course in Moodle.

#### Blue Quills First Nations College – Marilyn Shirt:

- Since 2005 offering a Cree Instruction certificate and introduced a Cree Instruction diploma in 2007
- Developing a 3 year Bachelor of Arts in Cree which is expected to grow into a 5 year joint degree with the final 2 years in a Bachelor of Education program
- The 1<sup>st</sup> year of the degree is designed to develop and improve fluency to develop the capacity to take part in a conversation.
- Masters in Cree program focuses on increasing fluent Cree speakers understanding of linguistics and practical application of that knowledge.
- As an institution accredited by the National Indigenous Accreditation Board

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	Blue Quills will have their Masters program reviewed by the Elders Quality Council to ensure the program meets the standards within the community.  The Elders Quality Council recently established, in part, to have a body oversee the quality and consistency of indigenous language instruction.
Terms of Reference	ACAT Articulation template was reviewed and revised by members to reflect the objectives and reporting of the group. Revisions to be updated on the template by the Secretariat and shared with the Committee.
Chair & Vice-Chair selection	Chair: Marilyn Shirt (Blue Quills First Nation College) volunteered to take on the role of committee Chair. She was acclaimed by the members as Chair.  Vice-Chair: Priscilla Campeau (Athabasca University) volunteered to serve as Vice-Chair and was acclaimed by members.
Next Meeting	Yellowhead Tribal College volunteered to host the next meeting (date TBD)
