
Sector Student Enrolment Flow

This report provides the student enrolment data for public post-secondary institutions by sector for a given academic year and student movement into, within and out of the sector.




A (Returning)	Students that were not enrolled in 2009-10, but had an enrolment record at some point between 2004 - 2009

E (Continuing On)	Students enrolled in the system for the following year (2011-2012)
F	Students enrolled in the system for the following year (2011-2012), and received a credential from Baccalaureate and Applied Studies Institutions in 2010-2011
G (Leaving)	Students NOT enrolled in the system in the following year (2011-2012)
Н	Students NOT enrolled in the system for the following year (2011-2012), but received a credential from Baccalaureate and Applied Studies Institutions in 2010-2

5. As of June 30, 2009, Taylor University College and Seminary became Taylor College and Seminary and ceased offering undergraduate academic baccalaureate programs, meaning no enrolments will be reported as of 2009-10.
