	Welcome and Introductions	
1.	Susan Bansgrove, VP Academic and Research from GPRC, welcomed us. She noted that dual credit can be a very effective tool in promoting the high school to post secondary transition, which is a pressing matter in some Alberta jurisdictions.	
	Review/Confirm Last Meeting's Minutes – February 17, 2016	
	Lana Rissling, AB Education, requested a few revisions to the minutes, and they were subsequently passed.	
	She asked for clarification of the fact that the researcher working on the grant reporting template was hired by the government (Item 3 in the Minutes), and provided the following edits to the Ministry perspective section in the Off-campus discussion (Item 12 in the Minutes):	
2.	Ministry perspective - we have to consider what is best for students in the off-campus experience. : In addition to the highlights on the 2-pager - other items to be addressed - i.e. in this section. Individuals can provide feedback on other off-campus items. : Education would like the Off-campus Education Handbook to be user friendly; because the bulk of the work falls on the shoulders of the Off-Campus Coordinator, we would like to ensure that everyone knows their roles. Related to some questions that have come up at different meetings, there are some items that would benefit from clarity.	
	Cathy Faber, Co-Chair, Dual Credit Steering Committee Update	
	The Steering Committee will continue until March 31, 2017. June 3 is the next steering committee meeting (requesting Articulation Committee chairs update at the meeting). Combined efforts will make the difference among both committees and the ministries.	
3.	Question/Comment - With the current funding situation, it is predicted that they will only be able to sustain dual credit for another year because costs are increasing.  Answer – It was acknowledged that this will be a challenge for everyone; the Steering Committee asked for additional support during transition period while we are waiting for data to be collected and analyzed, and urged the members to maintain opportunities if possible. Business, post-secondary, and industry partners are critical; the last thing we want to do is pause because we will lose credibility, integrity of the program, and our momentum.	
	<b>Committee Recommendation</b> - Ensure that we are mindful about the self-funded dual credit opportunities.	
	There was discussion of the CASS data collection	
	Question – Will partners have access to data or data collection?  Answer – As of right now, partners will have access to the data their partnership has	

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	provided/collected.	
	Question - A lot of post-secondary institutions have invested money in dual credit on their own and that story needs to be included. Are we going to include this data?  Answer – Yes, the data should be included in a separate collection. It can't currently be collected alongside the Strategy-funded data collection, but will plan for it as a next step.	
	<b>Recommendation</b> - Have a separate data collection/report for non-Strategy-funded opportunities, but make sure it is done in the same phase to create a solid place for data.

4.	Dual Credit students also shared stories about how dual credit has changed their lives. DC opportunities include business admininstration, psychology, calculus, as well as safety tickets. Dual credit changes lives; social media is the best place to connect with students especially re: student success stories.	
	From a school board perspective, cost can be a barrier to recruiting more students, but this decision is made by principals.	
	Three local school boards worked together to make sure all students got the same opportunities, so focus was on locally developed courses and on working with PSIs. Students like the support that GPRC gives them, like taking them out to dinner, supporting their learning, and helping them get their ID.
