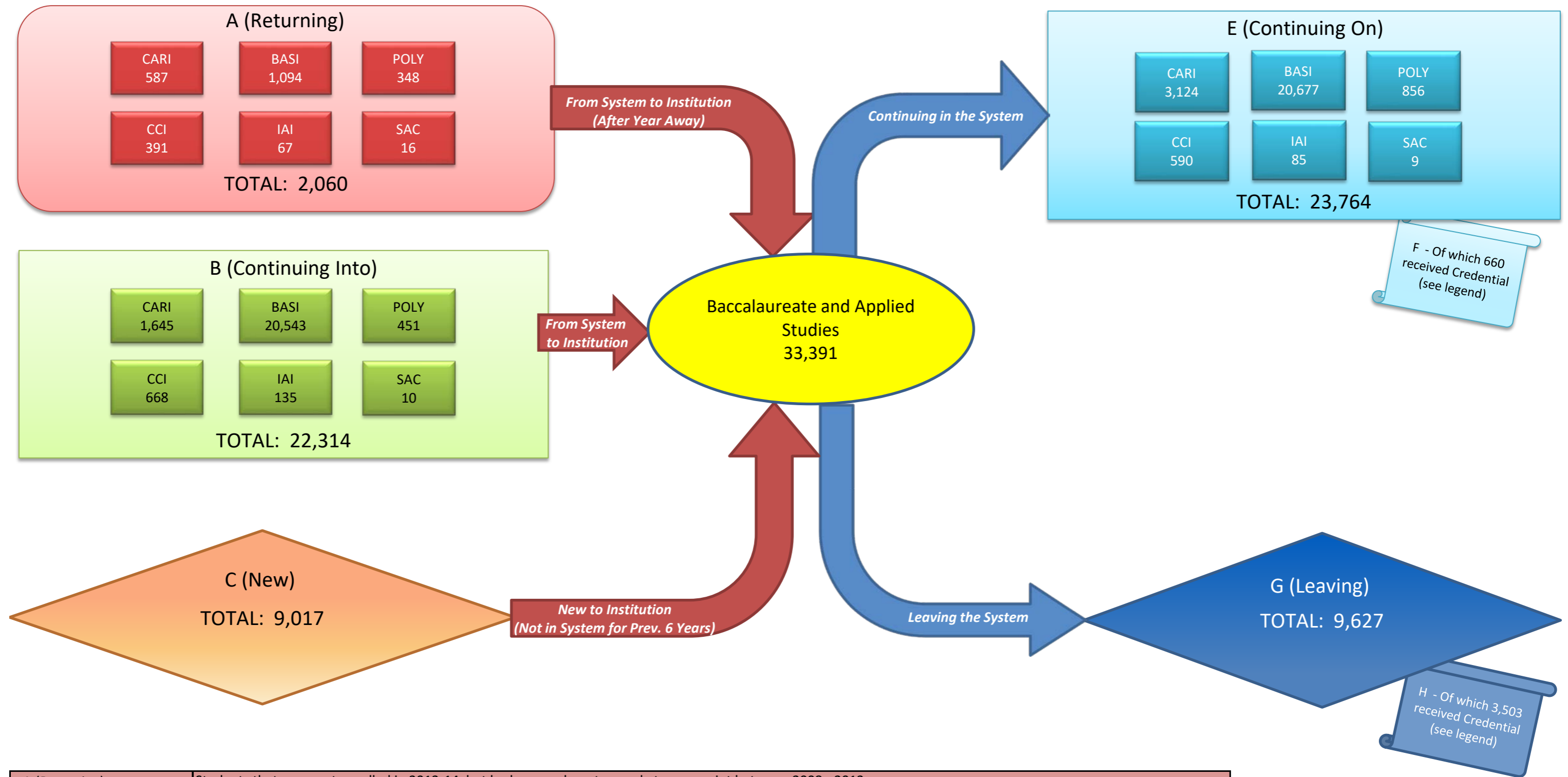


Sector Student Enrolment Flow

This report provides the student enrolment data for public post-secondary institutions by sector for a given academic year and student movement into, within and out of the sector.

Baccalaureate and Applied Studies 2014-2015



A (Returning)	Students that were not enrolled in 2013-14, but had an enrolment record at some point between 2008 - 2013
B (Continuing into)	Students that were enrolled in the system in 2013-14
C (New)	Students that had NO enrolment records in the previous 6 years (New to system)
D (Student Cohort)	Students enrolled full-time or part-time in the institution(s) in the cohort year (2014-2015)
E (Continuing On)	Students enrolled in an institution for the following year (2015-2016)
F	Students enrolled in an institution for the following year (2015-2016), and received a credential from Baccalaureate and Applied Studies in 2014-2015
G (Leaving)	Students NOT enrolled at an institution in the following year (2015-2016)
H	Students NOT enrolled in an institution for the following year (2015-2016), but received a credential from Baccalaureate and Applied Studies in 2014-2015

Notes:

1. Values listed in the above diagram represent the number of Unique Students at the level you are looking at; therefore, adding up sector numbers in each category may lead to an inflated value.
2. This report is sourced from LERS data, which contains enrolment data regarding all ministerially approved programs reported in LERS by publicly funded post-secondary institutions in Alberta's six sectors.
