Agenda Items

1. Alisa started by welcoming everyone, those attending in person and via teleconference, and thanking Deanna Singhal for hosting this year. She then welcomed new members Ali AL-Asadi from Grand Prairie Regional College and Melissa Boyce from University of Calgary.

5. Discussion of Indigenization:

Members discussed a number of different initiatives that their institutions were undertaking. Some institutions reported the consideration of making courses in Indigenous studies required to graduate. There was some discussion with regards to the complexities in hiring individuals to teach courses in Indigenous studies.

Members noted that the report from BCCAT highlights the importance of indigenization as an ongoing process.

Overview of BC Psychology Articulation Committee 2019 Meeting Randal Tonks, Chair

This year's meeting was held at Douglas College in New Westminster on May 2 & 3, and was attended by 25 of the 28 participating institutions; we received reports from 27 institutions. **We received a Spring Update from BCCAT** (available on their website) included:

- Transfer innovations fund where there is interest in having projects evaluate aspects of the transfer system.
- Transfer System Technologies where the website is being review for content and listing of active articulations.
- Work towards developing BCCAT as THE national transfer guide.
- Flexible Pre-Major report was recently written by Fiona McQuarrie and is available on the website, this will be discussed in more detail at next year's meeting.

Other discussion involved indigenization of psychology curriculum.

Many suggestions were made regarding possible manners in which this could happen, including altering content of courses, methods of instruction and evaluation, recognition of both past wrongs (i.e., Residential Schools) and forms of resilience among first nations peoples. Agreement was made to begin to develop a repository of resources on indigenization that we will share in our committee Moodle course.

Institutional Reports

Key issues of discussion based upon institutional reports were: International students and their preparedness, concerns over some plagiarism and cheating and our abilities to support them. This will form an item for discussion at our meeting next year.

We also examined the place of developmental psychology courses in the Flexible Pre-Major and whether or not childhood, adolescence, adulthood, or lifespan would be the best course for it. Some discussion was also made on the question of assessing math competencies for international students as well as the role of history of psychology course(s) in the undergraduate curriculum. Lastly we heard two colloquia: the first on "Conceptual Ambiguity, Depression, and Prognostic Pessimism" by Shakeel Lochan and the second on "Put, That, Phone, Down" By Dr. Janet Waters
