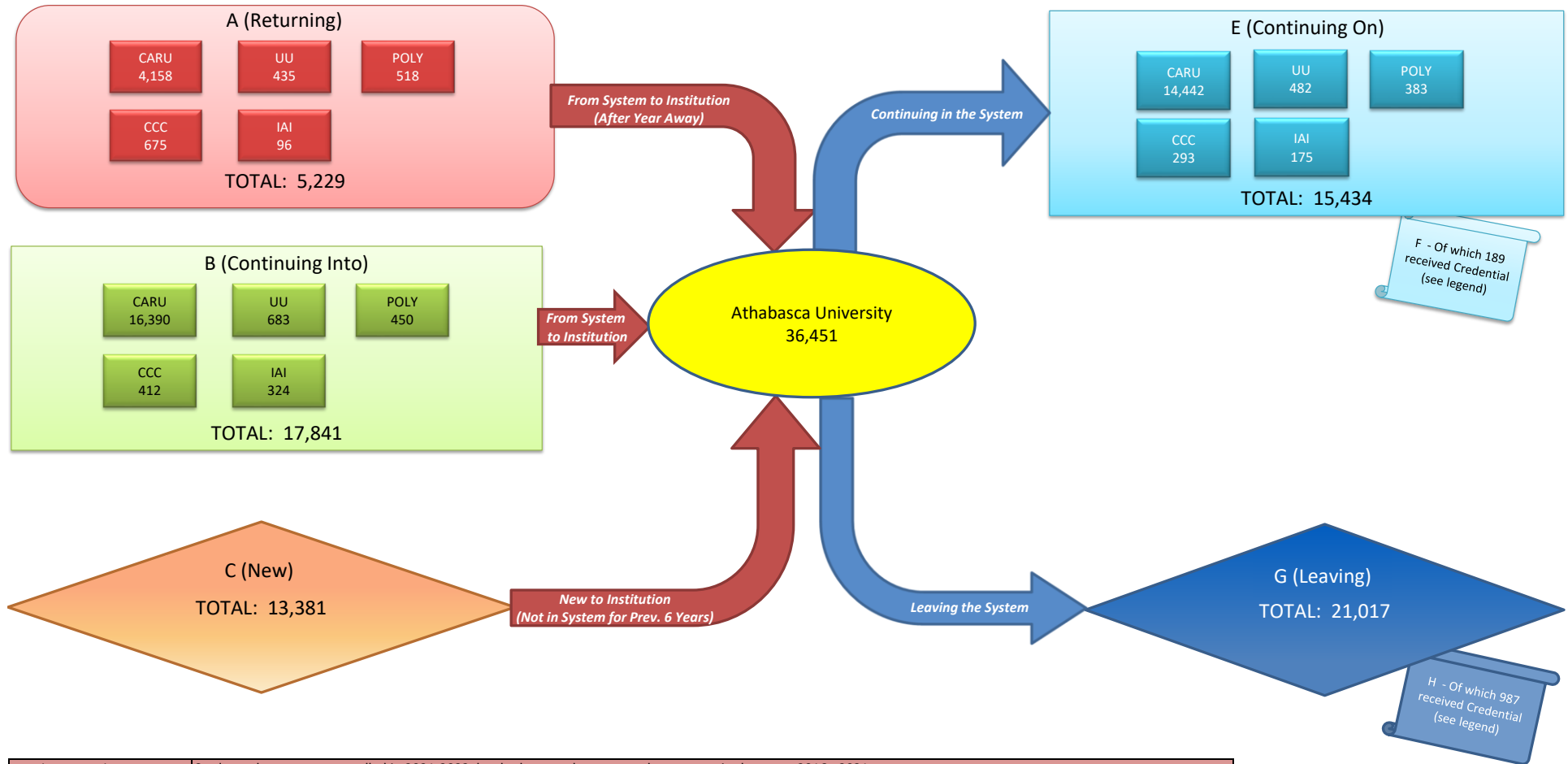


Institution Student Enrolment Flow

A (Returning)	Students that were not enrolled in 2021-2022, but had an enrolment record at some point between 2016 - 2021
B (Continuing into)	Students that were enrolled in the system in 2021-2022
C (New)	Students that had NO enrolment records in the previous 6 years (New to system)
D (Student Cohort)	Students enrolled full-time or part-time in the institution(s) in the cohort year (2022-2023)
E (Continuing On)	Students enrolled in an institution for the following year (2023-2024)
F	Students enrolled in an institution for the following year (2023-2024), and received a credential from Athabasca University in 2022-2023
G (Leaving)	Students NOT enrolled at an institution in the following year (2023-2024)
H	Students NOT enrolled in an institution for the following year (2023-2024), but received a credential from Athabasca University in 2022-2023

Notes:

1. Values listed in the above diagram represent the number of Unique Students at the level you are looking at; therefore, adding up sector numbers in each category may lead to an inflated value.
